Man bailed after 'suspicious device' reports

GORLESTON: A man in his 40s has been released on police bail following an incident which saw armed police called to a Gorleston home amid reports of a suspicious device. Police were called to Viking Close at 10.30am on Thursday morning. A seal was placed around the address whilst officers from the armed response and bomb disposal units carried out searches. The device was later identified as non-suspicious and two items, thought to be BB guns, were seized. A man, arrested in the Lowestoft area in connection with the incident, has been released on bail pending further enquiries until March 30. Supt Roger Wiltshire said: "I would like to thank local residents for their assistance whilst officers made their enquiries."

Flats could be built on old bingo site

The former Mecca Bingo site in the heart of Norwich could be turned into a 230-bed development of student flats.

The site, opposite John Lewis in All Saints Green, has been empty for five years, following the demolition of the former bingo hall.

London-based Alumno Developments has lodged an application with Norwich City Council for the flats, which would be specifically for students.

If planning permission for the project, known as The Quad, is granted, the development would be the company's second in Norwich, following the 220-bedroom development next to Norwich bus station.
